Our repeat prescription policy provides you with the essential information required to ensure you get your medication without delay.



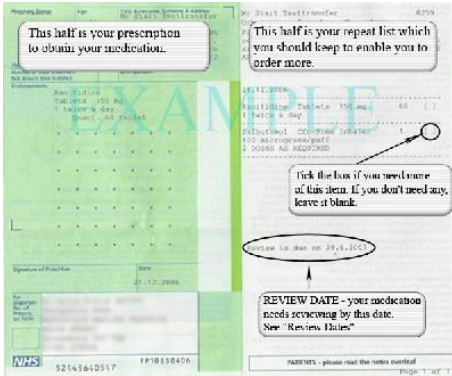
Repeat Prescriptions will be issued at the doctor's discretion and are normally for patients on long-term treatment. The following options for re-ordering medication are available.



Online - the easiest way is to order electronically via the link at the top of this page. Users new to the service are required to complete a simple registration.

In person - on your prescription there is a tear-off slip with the details of all the items you have been prescribed for repeated use.



To request a repeat prescription, tear off the slip and hand it to one of the receptionists in the surgery.

Otherwise, you can fill out the reverse of this form for the items you require and place in the white box.

By post - send it to us with a stamped addressed envelope if you want us to post it back to you.

Where possible please give the exact drug names when ordering along with your full name and date of birth. We require the drug name not what it is for eg: blood pressure or asthma.

We do not take prescription requests over the telephone.

Generic Medicines: Our practice attempts to use non-brand named (generic) medicines wherever possible as this saves the NHS a considerable amount of money. All hospitals use generic medicines. Most medicines have two names: the brand name which belongs to the company who originally manufactured it, and the generic name, which is the actual name of the medicine. Sometimes, therefore, you may see a drug on your prescription which differs from the name you know it by. Please be assured that the content of the drug is identical to that of the branded version. **If you have any queries ask your Pharmacist.**

Medication Reviews: Patients on repeat medication will be asked to see a doctor, nurse practitioner or practice nurse at least once a year to review these regular medications and notification should appear on your repeat slip. Please ensure that you book an appropriate appointment to avoid unnecessary delays to further prescriptions.

Please allow two full working days for prescriptions to be processed and remember to take weekends and bank holidays into account.

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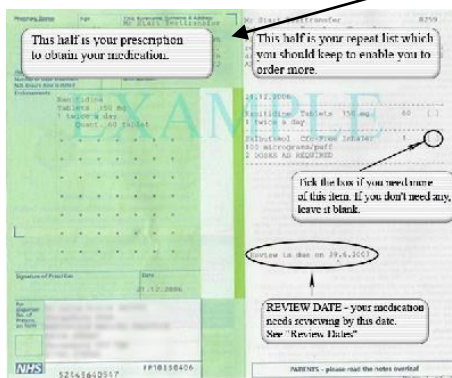
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
